Whether you are moving an expensive pience of art or your favorite pet, it can all be handled by professional speciality movers.




Types of Moves by Distance

Local Move

Local move is the type of move where a person or a family is moving to a new house which is in the same state as their current house. Majority of moves in the United States are local moves, where a person is moving from a few blocks to a few miles away but staying within the same state. Some companies also consider a move less than 100 miles a local move. For example, someone moving from Northern Virgnia to Bethesda, Maryland. Local moves are generally charged based on the number of hours and the number of movers needed for the move.



Long Distance or Interstate Move



A long distance move also known as and Interstate Move is where a person is moving to a different state. Moves like CA to AZ, FL to TX etc are considered Long Distance moves. Different companies have different ways of calculating cost of a long distance, but the most common factors to take into consideration are the distance of the move and the weight of your items.

- Enquire about whether the mover has a valid USDOT (U.S. Department of Transportation)
 number to make sure that your belongings are being transported legally and in a safe manner.

ASK ABOUT THE MOVING COSTS

- Ask your mover about price estimates that are binding and that would not exceed on the day
 of the move or any other time. This way, you can select a reliable moving company with
 competitive rates.
- Ask about moving charges pertaining to interstate moves, local moves, and international moves.

ASK ABOUT HOW THE MOVER INTENDS TO KEEP YOUR ITEMS SAFE

- -- Ask the moving company about how it intends to safeguard your walls, carpets, and interiors in your new home from being damaged on the day of the move.
- Enquire about compensation and insurance being provided to workers to rule out being liable for injuries occurring on your property.
- Ask about the claims procedure to deal with instances when goods get damaged during the move. If you are aware about the claims procedure, you will be able to handle claims when some of your valuables get damaged along the way.
- Enquire about the time of arrival of your consignments, which could vary for local, long distance, or international moves.
